B: FURTHER REGULATIONS

B1: ARTICLE 14: CONTROLS AND TIMING

14.4 Clarification of regulation:

“Late running time is 30 minutes per road section (ie: between successive time controls) and 40 minutes overall between Start and TC9 (ie: the Out control of the second service). Late time will reset so that the same late time will apply from TC9 to the Finish.

B2: ARTICLE 17: SERVICING AND SERVICE CREWS

17.4 Change to read:

“The event will have one service area which will be nominated in the instructions. Servicing is prohibited outside this area (ie: no intercept servicing allowed).”

Notes:

* Fuel usage is based on the ARC formula of 1.4 km/L for competitive sections and 5.0 km/L for liaison sections. A minimum fuel tank capacity of 45 litres plus reserve has been assumed by the Organisers.

+ Vehicles may refuel at the service park 18.75 km from the Finish. Fuel quantity required to reach the service park is 42.7 litres

B3: JUDGE OF FACT – PACE NOTES

A scrutineer appointed to the event will be a Judge of Fact in reporting to the Clerk of Course any observation of pace notes being used by a crew.

B4: BEGA VALLEY RALLY 'INTERSTATE CHALLENGE TROPHY' (SR 19.5)

An 'Interstate Challenge Trophy' has been introduced to the event to provide interstate interest. This trophy will be kept at the Eden Fishermen's Club. The winning state will be the state that accrues the least points on all the special stages that are completed.

Details of how this will be scored will be announced at the Competitor Briefing.

C: PRE-EVENT ACTIVITIES

C1: PROVISIONAL START ORDER

In accordance with SR Article 13.3 a copy of the Provisional Start Order is attached. Refer also to the event website under 'entries'. The final Start Order will be published in accordance with SR Article 13.5 A ballot for the first three starting positions will take place at the competitor briefing.

C2: SCRUTINY

C5: SERVICE CREW REGISTRATION (SR 17)

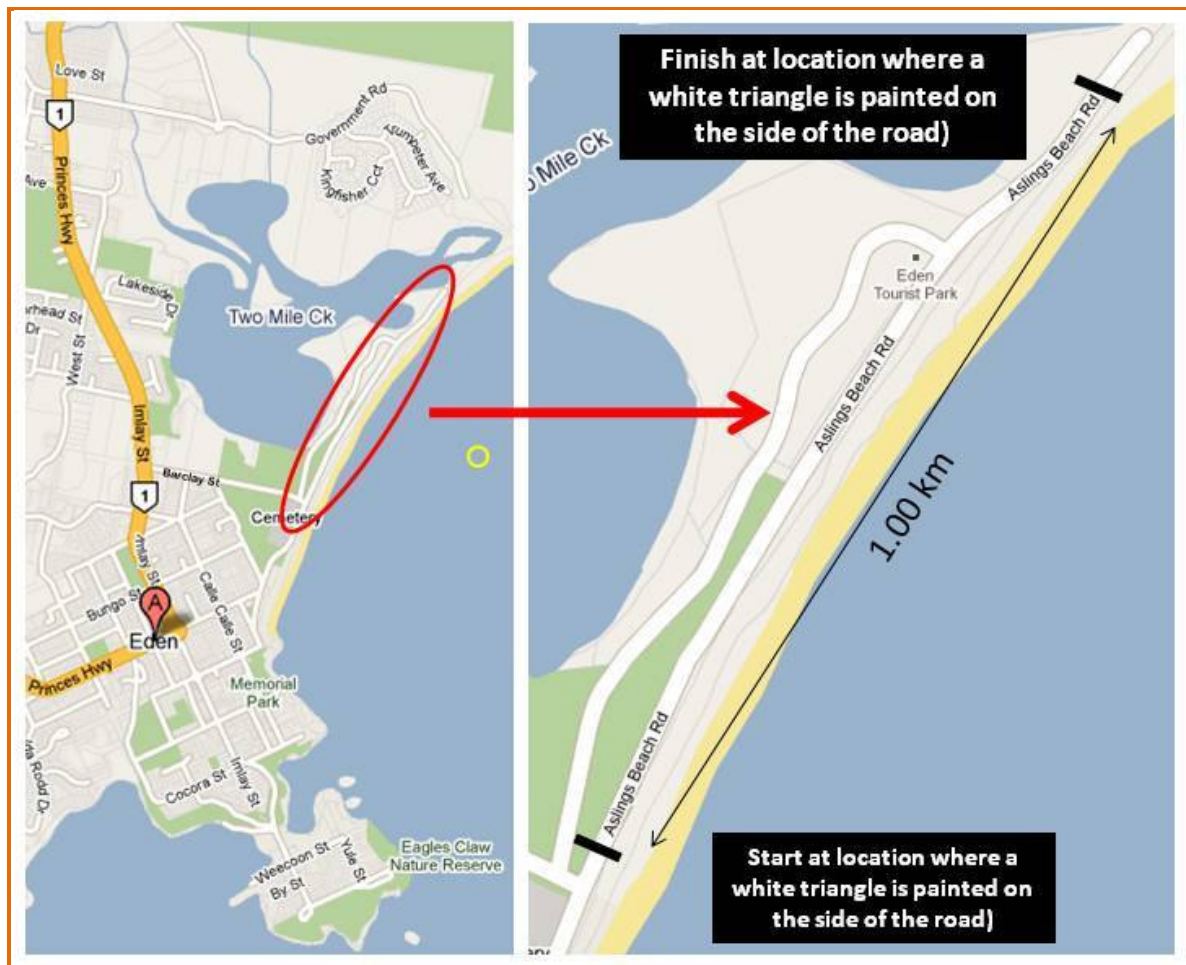
A service crew registration form is available from the event’s website (under ‘competitors’) and must be completed and handed into the event’s headquarters at the Eden Fishermen’s Club no later than 2000 hours on Saturday 12 June. Remember: ‘No registration - no CAMS insurance’

C6: COMPETITORS AND SERVICE CREW BRIEFING (SR 13.6)

Competitors are reminded of the official briefing, to be conducted between 1800 and 1830 hours on Saturday 12 June at the Eden Fishermen’s Club. Attendance is compulsory for BOTH members of the crew and at least one member of the registered service crew.

C7: ODOMETER CHECK

A one kilometre check course has been established by the organisers as follows. The distance measured 1.00km.



D: DURING EVENT ACTIVITIES

D1: EVENT SYNOPSIS

Refer to the event website under 'competitors'

D2: START OF EVENT

The event will start at 0900 with the first vehicle departing from Snug Cove Wharf. Remaining vehicles will leave at two minute intervals.

Competitors are required to report to the start assembly area via Weecoon Street, according to the following time schedule. The first 15 seeded vehicles are to be parked in seeded order from the start line. All other vehicles are to park in the wharf assembly area (refer sketch on page 5). Please report on time to allow for an orderly assembly.

Legend: 'ARRIVE' – due time to arrive at wharf; 'REPORT' – time to report to vehicle; 'START' – start time.

Darkness can be as early as 1700 with heavy cloud cover and up to 1720 on a clear day.

D4: FINISH OF EVENT

The event will finish in the Eden Fishermen's Club car park, with the first vehicle due at 1700. The last vehicle is scheduled to arrive at approximately 1940 (including full late time limit). Vehicles will be impounded as per supplementary regulation article 9.15, and will be released at a time determined by the Clerk of Course.

Competitors wishing to invoke article 9.16 may obtain a form from the event headquarters after arrival at the finish.

D5: PACE NOTES

The event does not permit pace notes. Competitors are advised that random checks WILL be made around the course. Pace notes are considered to be any document/s of any form, other than the official documents or maps issued by the organisers for the event.

D6: SERVICE PARK / REFUELLING

All servicing will be conducted at the Edrom Road Service Park and refuelling (other than at a service station) is only permitted at the Service Park, located opposite Edrom Road (18.14km south of Eden from the Eden roundabout). This area has a very hard ground surface and it will be difficult to insert stakes; crews should consider other methods of holding down shelter, just in case! Rain will not affect the ground surface (eg: it will not become muddy).

The service park is set up so that crews book-in upon arrival (TCs 4, 8, 12) and at that point have their time card changed over, with the used card given to the scorers. After service, crews book-in to the out control (TCs 5, 9, 13) and depart. There are no penalties for early book-in at the service park entry (TCs 4, 8, 12), so there is not milling around waiting for the right minute to come up.

The **Kiah Rural Fire Brigade** will be in attendance at the refuel area. **Catering** will be provided by the Kiah Hall Committee and will be available throughout the day. The 'girls' will be led by Joy-anne McGovern.

D7: 1080 POISON BAIT

All those associated with the event are advised that there is 1080 poison bait in the forests through which the event will be conducted. Signs indicate the broad area of the location of the bait.

D8: SCORES / RESULTS / PRESENTATION

Gary Hodgkiss will carry out scoring from the time cards at the Service Park. The following will apply:

- It is planned to score road cards at the service park and post stage times for examination of crews; this may not be possible for the last few stages;
- Unofficial scores will be placed on the results board at the event headquarters as soon as possible after the arrival of crews at the finish;
- Using the unofficial scores, an announcement and presentation of trophies to the winners at approximately 2130 of the various awards listed in SR 19.1 if this is practical:
 - Outright (19.1a)
 - NSW Championship Outright and Two Wheel Drive winner (19.1b)
 - Victorian Championship Outright and Two Wheel Drive winner (19.1c)
 - Victorian Hyundai Excel Series (19.1d)
 - Other awards – 1st outright as listed (19.1e).
- Announcement and awards will not be made to class winners on the night due to lateness of the finish;
- Provisional results will be issued by midnight Friday 18 June, and competitors will have until 2000 on 22 June (*or as otherwise advised in the publication of results*) in which to protest before they become final results (this allows for Australia Post delivery).

D9: STAGE TIMES ON WEBSITE

Separate to the scoring above, a results sweep will travel at rear of the field and transmit data back to HQ via the internet. At HQ the data will be accessed from the internet, compiled, and then publish the stage times to the website at: www.rallyresults.com.au/rally2010/bega

The website will be in same format of ARC results & viewed at www.rallyresults.com.au/arc/2010/nsw

This will **NOT** be the official event results site, but checks will be made to align the results with those produced by the scorer. The website will however provide early indication of stage times, and unofficial classification. Once Provisional & Final results are produced, copies of these will be posted to the website.

E1: SIGNING IN EACH DAY

Under state law all visitors to the Club are required to 'sign in' EACH DAY, and the entry slip kept on one's person whilst in the club. Please observe this rule.

E2: CLUB DRESS RULES

Rally personnel article would normally conflict with the club dress rules. However, the confines of the rules will be lifted for the duration of the event at the club.

E3: MEALS

The Old Tom's Dining Room at the club provides quite excellent meals with a wide range of food for selection.

'Normal' hours will apply on Friday and Saturday (noon to 1400; 1800 to 2030 – later if demand justifies).

On Sunday the club will set up a smorgasbord between 1900 and 2100 in the Auditorium for purchase of a meal.



Please note that the bar is operated separately to the dining area/s and only CASH is accepted – there is an ATM at the club. The restaurant takes all credit cards.

E4: COURTESY BUS

The club operates a Courtesy Bus and this will run on both Saturday and Sunday nights.

The event headquarters will be located at the club, with the official notice board on the upper floor.

F1: SERVICE STATIONS

F3: CAR WASH
